Farming and Operators, Fabricators & Laborers have experienced more fatalities than other occupations. Managerial and Precision production categories have recorded an experience of about one half the deaths of the leading two categories.

Farming had the highest percentage (23%) of all occupational categories. Operators at 22% was next and Technical Sales was at 21%. The lowest was Service at 7%.
